

# Australian School Based Apprenticeships

## Indigenous Employment Programme

Australian School Based Apprenticeships (ASBA's) let you train and do paid work in a wide range of trade and non-trade vocations while you are still at school studying for your South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE). As well as work, you will get extra training to build on the skills learned at work and at school. This training might happen while you are at work or at school, at a TAFE institute or a private training organisation.

Typically you will spend 1 or 2 days per week either at work or training, with the rest of the week at school. You might also do some paid work after hours, on the weekends or during school holidays.

## What's in it for me?

- Get paid for the part-time work you do
- Get a head start in the job market by either completing or making progress towards a nationally recognised Certificate II or III qualification before leaving school
- If you aim to finish Year 12 - your Australian Apprenticeship training will count for points towards your SACE
- Get real workplace experience and industry specific training in the area you choose - at no cost to you or your school
- Find out if a particular vocation suits you before leaving school
- Your Australian Apprenticeship can lead to tertiary education such as Diploma courses - some programs can contribute to your TER score
- Lets you reduce the number of school subjects you need to study
- Gain work experience in a safe environment with safety equipment provided
- Ongoing support from Maxima's Indigenous Support Officer, helping to ensure an effective working relationship between you and your host employer
